Are you concerned about the cost of compromising your company's customer data and reputation because of a network security breach? According to a CSI/FBI Security study done in 2003 there was a 2000% increase in financial losses from hacker-caused denial of service. A 2002 CERT Corporation Center Report found that the number of known computer security vulnerabilities more than doubled between 2000-2001, as did the number of reported incidents.

In today's environment, where Internet worms spread across the world in a matter of minutes or seconds, security systems and the network itself must react instantly.

A security system that is fully integrated into all aspects of the network can recognize potential suspicious activity, identify threats, react appropriately, isolate infections, and respond to attacks in a coordinated way.

The Cisco Self-Defending Network strategy allows organizations to use their existing investments in routing, switching, wireless, and security platforms to create a system that will help them identify, prevent, and adapt to both known and unknown security threats.
